Become a quiet refuge for others, a living reminder that, even now, heaven's calm is drawing near. In that stillness, you will know you are loved, guarded, and gently led onward always.

Prayer: A Pathway to Peace—Part 6 Savanna Barbarian

Work reading 254-50, given on July 14, 1929, speaks of peace without ever using the word. It grounds peace in function, cooperation, and conscious oneness with the Christ pattern. In Scripture, peace is never merely the absence of conflict; it is the active, living presence of God's order among people and within the heart. Jesus says in John 14:27, "Peace I leave with you; my peace I give to you. I do not give to you as the world gives. Do not let your hearts be troubled, and do not let them be afraid." This "peace" is not passive comfort but a dynamic alignment with the will and way of Christ.

Cooperation is equally essential. Colossians 3:15 exhorts believers, "And let the peace of Christ rule in your hearts, to which indeed you were called in the one body. And be thankful." Peace "rules" where cooperation, not rivalry, governs relationships. The Christ pattern is

one of self-emptying love, as Philippians 2:5–7 declares: "Let the same mind be in you that was in Christ Jesus, who, though he existed in the form of God, did not regard equality with God as something to be grasped, but emptied himself, taking the form of a slave, assuming human likeness." When we internalize this pattern of humility and service, peace becomes the natural fruit. When cooperation is reduced to a tactic for efficiency, it collapses under pressure. As a spiritual discipline, however, cooperation becomes a reflection of God's own life.

The nearly 20 Buddhist monks walking from Texas to Washington, D.C. on their "Walk for Peace" embody this same principle in a strikingly visible form. Their journey is not a political campaign or a quest for personal

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fame; it is a functional witness—a walking prayer. Step by step, they accept the humble "function" of being living signs of nonviolence. Their walking is a kind of liturgy in motion: a reminder that peace is not only a belief but a disciplined practice carried in the body. As they walk through cities and rural roads, they create unexpected spaces where strangers might reconsider what it means to live at peace with God, with each other, and with the earth itself.

"In these things, then, let each be mindful of that place, that niche, that purport each is to fill, and fill that with all of the power, might, strength, that lies within that body!"* Peace, in Mr. Cayce's language here, is not passivity but a fully inhabited vocation. Inner conflict eases when one accepts, rather than resists, the soul's unique "niche" and lives it with undivided energy.

"So cooperate with other individuals, working in their individual capacities, that the whole purport may be as one, even as the Father and I are one in you."* The reading links peace to structure: differentiated roles, consciously harmonized. The model is Trinitarian oneness: distinction without separation. Fragmentation—personal, social, planetary—begins

to heal when cooperation is pursued as a spiritual discipline rather than a mere tactic.

"Let each, then, in that power that may be gained in that association of the forces as manifest through each, become one in purpose."* The culmination of peace is not uniformity of opinion but unity of purpose—souls aligned, capacities differentiated, forces associated, all ordered toward a single, Christ-centered intent.

The monks walking for peace form one small strand of this worldwide movement. Though many may not name Christ in the same way, their commitment to nonviolence, compassion, and prayer resonates with the heart of the gospel. Their feet on the pavement proclaim, without words, that another pattern of life is possible—one that refuses to accept war, hatred, and indifference as inevitable. In this, they stand alongside Christian, Jewish, Muslim, and many other peacemakers whose lives echo Jesus's blessing in Matthew 5:9: "Blessed are the peacemakers, for they will be called children of God."
